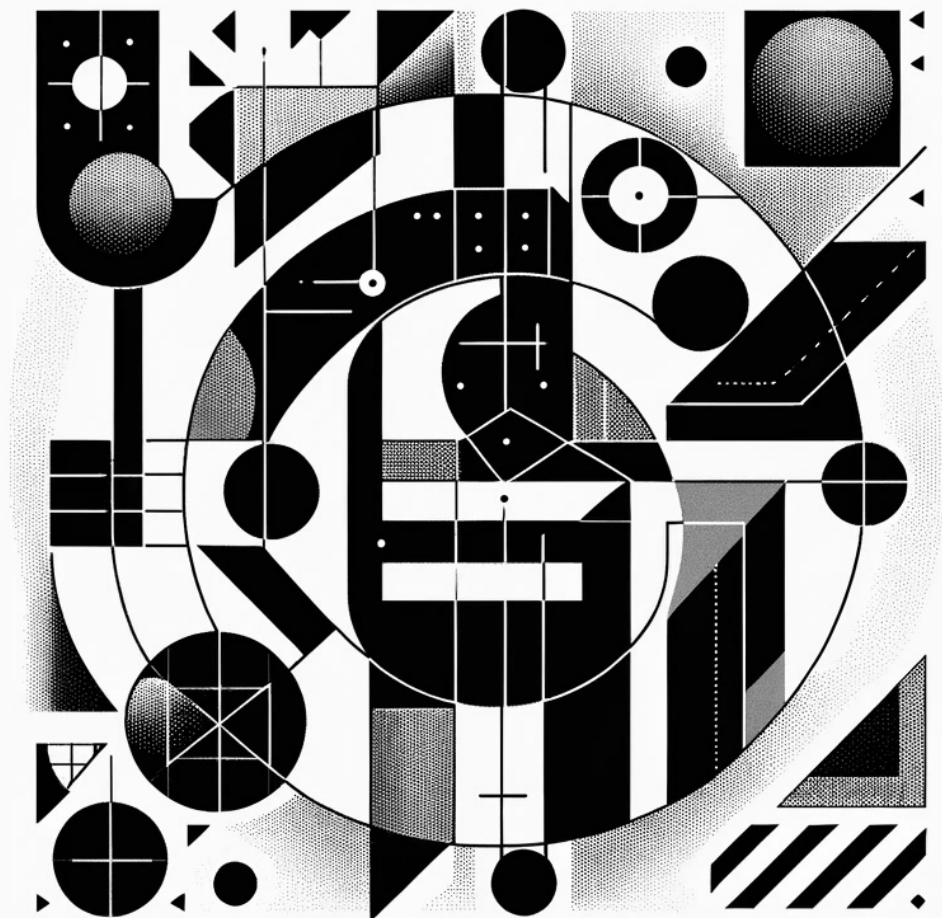
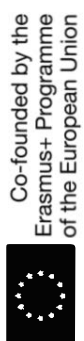

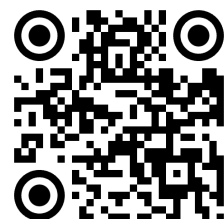

The Favara Project: Space recontextualized. The Favara village was a small uninhabited village due to its residents migrating in search of work. “ When the lived experience of architecture untangles the complexity of memory and imagination, light becomes the only medium to grant access to the space in order to imagine : and so the ephemeral moments of our recollections become shaper.”

"From 'Zoetropolis' to 'Planars,' the public space in Weimar (DE) serves as a case study for the collective work of mammasONica. The unique character of the location, its historical essence, architectural style, and social and cultural nuances, along with ingrained local customs, greatly inspire narrative construction.

Public projections carve out a path beyond the usual distribution channels, integrating into and enhancing the environment, creating inventive cinematic spaces, and redirecting the community's attention back to the public sphere.

Violence has to do with manipulation of predominant space, by means of isolation in it or exclusion from it. In our lives every day we encounter spaces that have predefined meaning for us. Those spaces can be mental, political, cultural, artistic, social, gender, transgender, psychological and physical ones. Meaning exists and defines the performative space of our identities and our relationships as a concept behind the everyday use of photographic images in the form of posts; selfies, just waiting for our awareness to make it visible. Through those images and their meaning for us we feel our belonging in or exclusion from the spaces we attempt to enter. As a predominantly visual culture we need to explore a working process that will interpret differently and allow integrative new experiences that can make us aware of these invisible structures of seeing. Thus to change spaces from exclusion to inclusion we need to examine and communicate inaccurate or even missing narratives of spaces, connecting masculinities or fatherhood with the public and femininities or motherhood with the private.

In this workshop we will dare to explore and observe how one can draw attention to words or stories not yet told, amplify understated voices, and make unrecognized connections can help us generate new modes of perception of space as well as how artistic expression that involves different forms of narrative. Those redefinitions can stand as a form of cultural resistance to exclusion violence and instead of keeping us passively repeating someone else's narrative of space can enable us to observe anew how images and people relate to each other in specific times and places. Once we can figure out the old unproductive patterns we can invent new ones that can help us produce new ones that can free us.

The photographic message through contemporary artistic approaches. From the idea of a photobook/zine to its realization. Analogue and digital representations will be combined to create a unique object d'art.

How many places constitute a place? Linger between the definite and the indefinite, any attempt to define place, as tangible a notion as it may seem, is elusive. From the way that countries are defined on maps to the constraints of an apartment or a public square. Place in the urban context is demarcated, named, and then owned: irrevocably, territory entails property and brings to the fore the distinction between private and public. Yet can we always tell if the limits are clear? And how does this occur in photography where by definition everything becomes public once it is shot.

Photography, Derrida shows us, is really about time. When you photograph a foreign city you are taking a shot of a city "already condemned to expire." Should you return to the city, the place recorded in your photographs will be a lost city. In a way, ordinary tourist photographs are really shots of something that is already gone. In this context, a mode of presentation is proposed that refers to a visual diary featuring the city (urban, suburban, portrait and memento mori).

These cities' position at the crossroads of three continents make an ideal location for story-laboratories to investigate some of the key changes and contemporary issues of our time (such as migration, migrant culture, equality, new citizens, mobility as human right)

This workshop will collaborate closely with the learners and aims to engage with the city through multidisciplinary creative storytelling mediums and will encourage cultural exchange , intercultural communication and problem solving

The underlying ambition is to generate new connections ,discussions, dialogues, insights and develop a new narrative through visual creativity .

Investigating place with psychogeography and photography: Psychogeography Collages / Sense of a place

As photographers we are used to wandering the streets looking for interesting things to take pictures, but in reality, how much do we actually see? It is easy to fall into familiar patterns and ways of photographing that can lead to predictable results.

How can we get in touch with the world around us? How do we see beyond the obvious? How can we investigate and respond in creative ways to a place? What is psychogeography?

Psychogeography is defined as : the geographical environment of a particular location, typically a city, considered with regard to its influence on the mind or on behavior. It is also a way of moving through environments such as domestic sites, historical sites, edge lands, and a framework for creative practice. Psychogeography is a useful creative tool for artists when looking to investigate a place in an immersive non-linear way.

How do different places make us feel and behave? What creative approaches might we take that respond to the histories of specific sites, their edge lands and margins?

In this workshop: with psychogeography and photography the learners will engage with the environment. Participants will make connections between people and the land and investigate how a place can make us feel , behave and even see.

Image and text.

There are many ways in which text can add to a photograph. Text can explain the image or give further contextual information. Words can expand / surprise / challenge / complicate / reveal / change / explain / describe / elaborate / narrate images. This workshop combines theory and contemporary visual storytelling practices and aims to examine how representation, gender and identity interact, and therefore reveals a political approach. It focuses on the creative ways of juxtaposing text (linguistic message) and image (chain of signifiers). Participants of the workshop are introduced to the theory of visual storytelling and examples from contemporary art/, and then experience various creative methods to tell a visual story. Going through the process of idea-concept-visualization, they discover ways to convey their own stories to others by creating an original visual language with various tools such as text, photography, drawing, found objects, and so forth.
